The words of which the initial letter is capitalized have meanings defined under the following conditions. The following definitions shall have the same meaning regardless of whether they appear in singular or in plural.

For the purposes of this Cookies Policy:

- “Company” (referred to as either "the Company", "We", "Us" or "Our" in this Cookies Policy) refers to **Beetroot Consulting Ltd.**
- “Cookies” means small files that are placed on Your computer, mobile device or any other device by a website, containing details of your browsing history on that website among its many uses
- “Website” refers to **Beetroot Consulting Website**, accessible from **www.beetrootconsulting.org**

- **Cookies Policy / Notice Acceptance Cookies**

Purpose: These Cookies identify if users have accepted the use of cookies on the Website.

- **Functionality Cookies**

Type: Persistent Cookies

Administered by: Us

Purpose: These Cookies allow us to remember choices You make when You use the Website, such as remembering your login details or language preference. The purpose of these Cookies is to
